



These two pairs of images show two different ways to map a length of road. The images labeled "Profile and Surface Chart" show the grade levels and surface conditions along a route. The images labeled "Route Map" provide a more commonly encountered form of a map. They illustrate the routes that link two or more locations but do not provide information about the condition of the route. By providing both types of maps, the Mohawk-Hobbs Grade and Surface Guide gave travelers more information than many individual maps did.




Profile and Surface Chart: Tifton – Lake City. From *The Mohawk-Hobbs Grade and Surface Guide*.
